The Poet's Shadow Character Guide



In order of vocal appearance:



Elizabeth: A young woman on the cusp of adulthood. She suffers from depression and uses her poetry as an outlet. She is convinced that no one truly knows or understands her.



Mrs. Peacock: Elizabeth's mother. She is deeply concerned for her daughter's welfare and is worried about her daughter's increasing anti-social behavior and immaturity. She is warm-hearted and passionate about the beauty she sees all around her.



Beautiful Love: Elizabeth's ex-boyfriend. He is a hopeless romantic and still deeply loves Elizabeth—their breakup came out of the blue for him. He desperately wants to get back together again.



The Rose: A rose that grows in the center of the Peacock's garden. Before the action of the play she was a woman who had been betrayed in love. To prevent her from harming herself or dying, the fairies allowed her to sleep and transformed her into a Rose. She is newly woken and aware of herself since she heard Elizabeth's voice.



The Fairy Guide: Ally of the Rose, sent to help Elizabeth to find her way through her depression. The Fairy Guide represents the world in balance and harmony.



The Monster: An amalgam of the fear, rage, upset and hopelessness that Elizabeth feels. It is a destructive force born of her creativity and the depth of her despair.
